This articulation agreement has been established between Cape Cod Community College and the University of Massachusetts Lowell Criminal Justice Department. This agreement was developed with the intent of facilitating the transfer process from Cape Cod Community College to the University of Massachusetts Lowell.

This agreement will serve as a guideline for those who desire transfer into the Criminal Justice major at the University of Massachusetts Lowell. UML's designated representative will be Gerald J. Durkin, Dean of Enrollment, Director of Transfer Admissions and Cape Cod Community College's representative will be Mary Olenick, the Transfer Advisor.

Cape Cod Community College and University of Massachusetts Lowell agree to the following:

- Cape Cod Community College students who complete the Criminal Justice Program, and who have earned the Associate of Science with a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better, will be guaranteed acceptance into the University of Massachusetts Lowell College of Art & Sciences, Criminal Justice major. Students who do not meet the aforementioned minimum standards will be considered for admission to the University of Massachusetts Lowell on a case-by-case-basis.
- Cape Cod Community college students completing the Associate in Science – Criminal Justice Program will receive academic credit for courses graded "C-" or better, subject to the transfer credit policy of the University of Massachusetts Lowell. The "UMASS LOWELL TRANSFER AGREEMENT" attached to this document outlines those courses which transfer directly into the Criminal Justice major at the University of Massachusetts Lowell.
- Students graduating in the Criminal Justice program apply through the free MassTransfer application. They are eligible for a 33% tuition waiver if overall grade point average is 3.0 or higher and they enroll within one year of graduating from CCCC.
- Students graduating in the Criminal Justice program transfer to UMass Lowell as Juniors. Students must complete a minimum of 60 credits at UMass Lowell for the Bachelors degree in Criminal Justice.
- Courses judged below college level by the University of Massachusetts will not be transferable
- No credit will be transferred which was awarded for life experiences, military, police or other training.

This agreement shall remain in effect for a period of two years from the date indicated below with the provision that the terms specified herein will continue to apply to students who transferred from Cape Cod Community College within one year of the expiration of this agreement. Each institution agrees to provide timely notice to the other in the event of any modification to the curriculum that might affect compatibility for transfer.
